It's been a very busy few months in the houses and we are pleased to have accommodated another three young people in our homes. The team have been supporting residents to engage with the community and have visited organisations such as the Berkshire Training Consortium which has resulted in two interviews for apprenticeships for our residents. Residents have also supported and visited the Thatcham community larder.

The team organised an online quiz night between the houses which was a tremendous success with the winning house being Hope House, it was such a hit with the residents we are going to have a quiz once a month. We are also having a staff and residents away day Paintballing and I predict that I will be the main target on the day (the things I do for the charity).

Cornerstone has had a re-decoration and is looking amazing and all residents have been involved in looking at the Young People & Children's First's <u>Amazon wish list</u> for items to make the houses more homely.

One of our residents is going to have her artwork exhibited at the West Berkshire museum and we are all very proud of them and excited to go and visit the exhibition. Another resident was interviewed by Heart FM and spoke knowledgably about the cost of living increase.

Laura Ferris MP for West Berkshire visited our accommodation and chatted with residents about the barriers for young people leaving care, one youngster told Laura "if there were more places like YPACF in the country it would help", well we would fully agree with that statement.

A total of £633 was raised which will be spent on upgrading a bathroom at our charity home.












Sunday 10th July Asics 10k run in London
